Assessment based on:

- <u>regular class attendance</u> no more than 2 absences, if you miss more than 2 classes, you will have to retake the course (first week not counted)
- <u>active participation during the lessons, completing homework</u> for the lessons you will be asked to do homework as well as some prior reading;
- <u>2 tests</u> a mid-term and an end-of-term test, including theory (reading assignments + lectures) + notes from the seminars; you can obtain **100 points** for the tests (50 points for each test).

During the course you can collect 100 points altogether. If you have 50 points or more, you will be offered a grade. If you do not accept the grade or have not collected at least 50 points, you will have 3 chances to take the MET1 exam (a written test from the whole course) during the exam period.
